How to use this book

All the activities in this book can be used either as short stand-alone activities or as part of a longer session, with other activities. You may like to use them to introduce the children to a Bible story, or to remind them of a Bible story that you have just listened to, and to get them involved in more of the detail. Each picture activity is designed to stimulate further thought on, and discussion of, the Bible story at the level of under-5s, as well as to provide them with plenty of fun!

Read through each activity before the session, so that you can ensure you have all the art materials you need. Most of the activities will require only crayons, paints, glue and collage materials, but some of them use less everyday art materials to get particular effects.

Have fun! A relaxed, welcoming and loving environment may tell the children in your group as much about God's love for them as the retelling of a Bible story.

A taster verse or two of the actual Bible text is also given. You could use this to help children relate the Bible stories to a complete Bible. Try looking up the verse in your Bible and showing the children the same words on the Bible page. (All actual Bible text used here comes from
