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How to use this book

All the activities in this book can be used to introduce your child to a Bible story, or to remind them of a Bible story that you have just shared together and to get them involved in more of the detail. Each picture activity is designed to stimulate further thought on, and discussion of, the Bible story at the level of under-5s, as well as to provide them with plenty of fun!

Before you start, read through the notes to check you have all the art materials you need. Most of the activities need only crayons, paints, glue and collage materials, but some of them do use some less everyday art materials to get particular effects.

Have fun! Your relationship with your child can tell them as much about God's love for them as the retelling of a Bible story.

A taster verse or two of the actual Bible text is also given. You could use this to help your child relate the Bible stories to a complete Bible. Try looking up the verse in your Bible and showing your child the same words on the Bible page. (All actual Bible text used here comes from the CEV translation.)

Tell the story. The retelling of each Bible story has been written in a way that is accessible to under-5s.

Why not read the story from the Bible yourself before you start, to remind yourself of the details?

Tell the story

"Thank you, God, for keeping your promise," he said. "Thank you for our new place to live."

Thank you, God, that you always look after us and give us the things that we need.

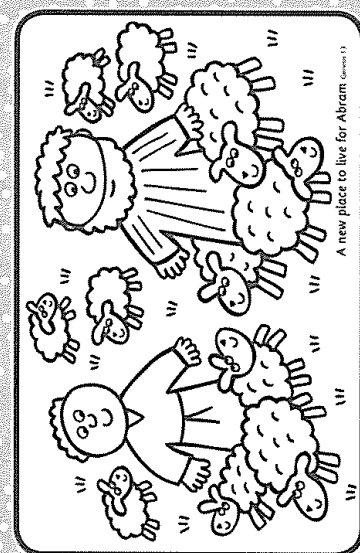


Use the picture

1 You can use the picture as an introduction to the Bible story or to help you review the story together.

2 Do the children remember what God had told Abram to do? God had told him to leave his home. So Abram did. God said he would give Abram a new place to live and a large family. How did Abram do that?

3 Look at the picture of Abram and let with all their sheep. The sheep need water to drink and grass to eat. Let the children colour or decorate the picture with collage materials.
