

Mark 16:6 "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here."

When judging whether someone has done something like committing a heinous crime, the jury must be convinced that the person was there at the time the crime happened. If the defendant can prove they were somewhere else completely, and this is verified by reliable eyewitnesses, they are unlikely to be convicted of that crime. They will be deemed innocent, truth tellers. Any good jury examines the evidence in pursuit of truth. It's a bit like that with the resurrection of Jesus. If it can be proven that Jesus was not in the tomb after three days, then...

He is a truth teller

Jesus claimed on several occasions that he would die and rise again.* He also verifies his own testimony made to Pilate at his trial, that he came to bear witness to the truth. The truth about himself and God.

He was innocent

The sinless Son of God, who he claimed to be. Death could not hold him because the sins he died for were yours and mine, not his own.**

He has the power to deliver

When Jesus promised you and I eternal life when we receive him as Lord and Saviour, we can be convinced that He has the power to deliver.

So, like any good crime investigation, take another look at this resurrection cold case, review the evidence for yourself, and decide what Jesus' perfect and divine innocence, and resurrection means for you.

John 11:25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"
